Isn't it wonderful how during this time of year, you can feel the “spirit of Hanamatsuri” echo throughout our community? Families are getting together and decorating their Hanamido with flowers and lights, children are on their best behavior in anticipation of their yearly visit by the Hanamatsuri Bunny (part time job of the Easter Bunny), visions of manju dancing in their heads. All the families getting in their orders of Kentucky Fried Chicken to make sure they will have enough Kentucky Fried Chicken for their annual Hanamatsuri Lunches with family and friends. As Johnny Mathis sings, “It's the most wonderful time of the year!”

Just kidding everyone, it's just my imagination running away with me. However, we do always get to eat Kentucky Fried Chicken at the luncheon along with our Hanamatsuri program at the temple. Our Hanamatsuri traditions are still evolving. When I was in Dharma School, Hanamatsuri meant Japanese movies on Saturday night, and also on Sunday after the children's program. (Jimmy's Flower Shop) so lovingly prepare for our temple every year. We don't have a Hanamatsuri Bunny; the Easter bunny never really impressed me anyway. Although, I liked the idea of an Easter Bonnet and new clothes for Easter, maybe we can have Hanamatsuri shoes and new clothes for Hanamatsuri. As for presents under the Hanamatsuri Tree, there are many people that have complained about the commercialization of Christmas, why would we want to do that with Hanamatsuri? What would Buddha think?

I would like to suggest an idea for Hanamatsuri gift giving that we may try. During Ohigan I expressed that traditionally the practice of the six paramitas were emphasized as a means for reaching the other shore. In fact, I suggested that we try the first paramita: Dana (selfless giving), as a way of practicing these paramitas. During the Ohigan service, I suggested we try to practice Dana by using kind words towards each other, for just one hour. I'm not sure how long we could follow this practice. If you did it for one minute great, at least you tried. If we can each make an effort in these types of practices, we can change the world.

I truly doubt that we will ever have Hanamatsuri as a national holiday. I don't believe we could convince the Easter Bunny to switch from Easter to Hanamatsuri; we just don't have the numbers. Having Hanamatsuri lights on the Hanamido with all that sweet tea, might prove to be a fire hazard. However, as for Hanamatsuri gifts! That's something I like the sound of, although I'm not talking about material presents with fancy paper and shiny ribbons. What if we can make Hanamatsuri presents as gifts of the heart? Some of the gift suggestions for Hanamatsuri would be the gifts I began this article with. In Monshu Koshin Otani's book, Buddha's Wish for the World, he lists these seven gifts that require no personal possessions to give. I believe this would be a wonderful tradition we could start at our temple and homes and we don't have to worry about the size or if they will like it. Who doesn't like to be spoken to kindly or smiled at? Let's give it a try! Happy Hanamatsuri and to all a good night!

President's Message

I hope you all are doing well.

Springtime is here and, as apparent by this Geppo issue, the start of some very busy times at the Temple. I hope to see you at some of these many events.

Kirk Y. and I attended the National Council meeting 26 thru 28 February in San Jose. As usual, the meeting was informative, but this year was particularly special because the Shinran Shonin 750th memorial was also observed.

Following are some highlights of the meeting:

- 1) Longmont Buddhist Temple – The Longmont Buddhist Temple (LBT) of Longmont, CO, petitioned to become independent from the Tri-State / Denver Buddhist Temple and establish direct affiliation with the BCA.

After much discussion, LBT's proposal was approved by vote of the National Council members. Kirk and I met the LBT representatives during the final banquet and they were all very nice. We wished them well in their efforts and since they are part of the Mountain States District, you may all have the opportunity to meet them in the future.

- 2) BCA Budget – The 2010 BCA budget, as formulated by the national Budget & Finance Committee, was presented for approval.

It was explained that this year's budget was very challenging due to the expected loss of many BCA members nationwide. Although final numbers are not yet known, it is estimated that BCA will lose approximately 445 members. The Budget & Finance Committee closely examined the budgets requests from each national sub-committee and reduced the total BCA budget by about \$45,000 from that allocated in 2009. Depending on the final 2010 membership, it is anticipated that the \$85.64 per member assessment of should not change appreciable this year. The proposed 2010 BCA budget was voted on and approved.

3) Jodo Shinshu Center (JSC) Financial Status – To date, over \$18.3 million has been collected from various fund raising efforts. In addition, joint efforts by the Campaign BCA Committee and the BCA Endowment Foundation have reduced the loan payment from \$77,000 per month to \$30,545 per month. The most recent fund raising effort was to raise a total of \$300,000 before the 2010 National Council meeting. The Mountain States District successfully met our allocated percentage that was based on our membership.

Overall, the JSC's financial situation has improved greatly over the past several years but much additional support is still required. Again I ask that you consider contributing to this very special cause that will help promote the growth of Jodo Shinshu Buddhism in the United States.

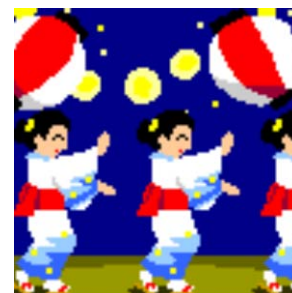

1. Eligibility. We require all players to be at least ¼ Asian or Pacific Islander or an active JACL member. Exceptions will be made for **ONE** player to be non-asian or a non-JACL member. Please note the player eligibility on the registration form. All players must be at least 15 years old.
2. Teams will be guaranteed to play at least two games. Because of the number of teams are not known at this time, draws may include a Bye. Teams will be drawn on a blind draw basis.
3. The revolving trophy will be presented to the winning team after the championship play. Awards will be presented to 10 players on the winning team.
4. Each team is responsible for their own insurance coverage.
5. Each team must have matching uniforms with numbers. No Uniforms – No play.
6. Rosters may have more than 10 players. Only players listed on the roster may play on that team. Players can only be on one roster. Teams using players not on their roster will be disqualified.
7. Utah State High School Rules will govern each division regarding the conditions of play of the games. Games will be 20 minute halves with the last 2 minutes on a stop/go on the clock.

Service at 1:00 p.m.**

This service is to celebrate the birth of Shinran Shonin (1173-1262), the founder of our sect. It is also called Fujimatsuri in reference to the Wisteria flower which represents our sect. Unlike other flowers which seem to stand up straight and tall when in full blossom, the wisteria hangs down, when in full bloom, as if in humility. This teaches us that a true and real human being does not stand up in arrogance at their accomplishments, but rather realizes that they have so much for which to be grateful.

In connection with this very special observance, we hold Shosanshiki also know as Hatsumairi (First visit ceremony) or Infant Presentation service. This service is held for all children born into our Sangha over the past year. It is a day to present the child to Buddha and to the Sangha, and to celebrate their first step upon following the Dharma.

Guest Speaker: Rev. Patti Nakai

Rev. Patti Nakai is a third generation Japanese American, born in Chicago. She graduated from the University of Minnesota, studied international economics and Japanese history and culture. She was teaching Dharma School at the Buddhist Temple of Chicago when encouraged by Dr. Nobuo Haneda to study Buddhism in Japan. Rev. Nakai studied at Otani University in Kyoto, Japan from 1984 -1987. She received her Master's degree in Shin Buddhist studies in 1987 and also full ordination (kyoshi) at the Higashi Honganji temple in Kyoto. Rev. Nakai served as non-resident minister at the Higashi Honganji Los Angeles Betsuin from 1987 to 1995. Since 1995 serving as non-resident minister at the Buddhist Temple of Chicago and as instructor and director of the temple's educational center.

Rev. Nakai has written several articles, which are available on-line at LivingDharma.org, such as "Women's Liberation in Buddhism"

This is a memorial service for the wife of Shinran Shonin, Eshinni. Eshinni is considered the first role model of Jodo Shinshu womanhood. In this regard the memorial service is held in memory of any BWA member who died during the previous year.
